# 2025 Annual Report Highlight

Because of the continued support of our community, CrossWinds is reaching more individuals than ever before!

The impact of our advocates, donors, and partners can be seen clearly in the growth reflected throughout last year's service numbers. In 2025, CrossWinds served 4,183 individuals, an increase of 272 people from the year prior. At the same time, total services climbed to 179,447, marking a 59% increase since 2023.

These numbers represent more than growth. Every number tells a story of someone who received care, found stability, or took a step forward. That progress is made possible by all those who stand with CrossWinds. Through continued advocacy and support, our community is helping ensure that behavioral health services remain available, accessible, and stigma-free for all.



## Reviving Rural: Coffey County

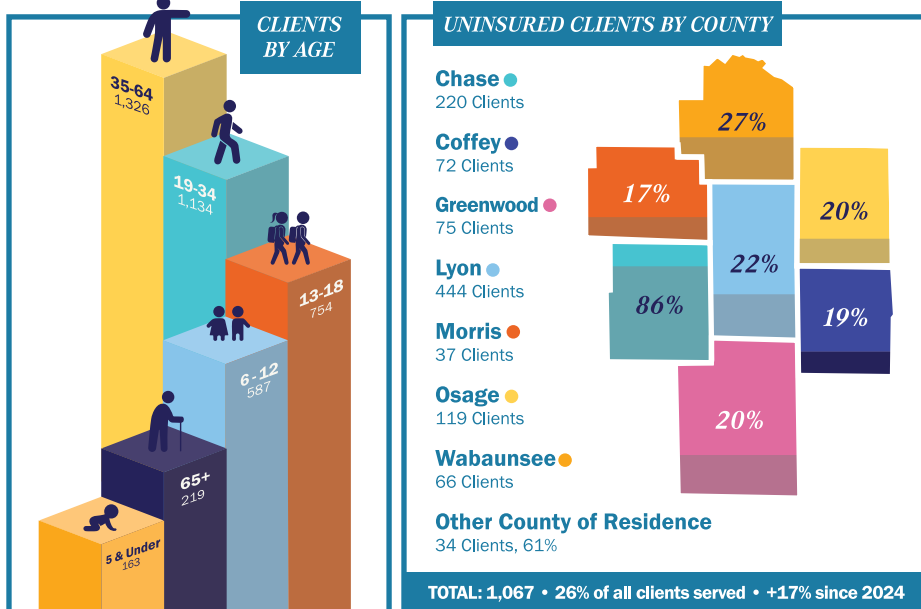
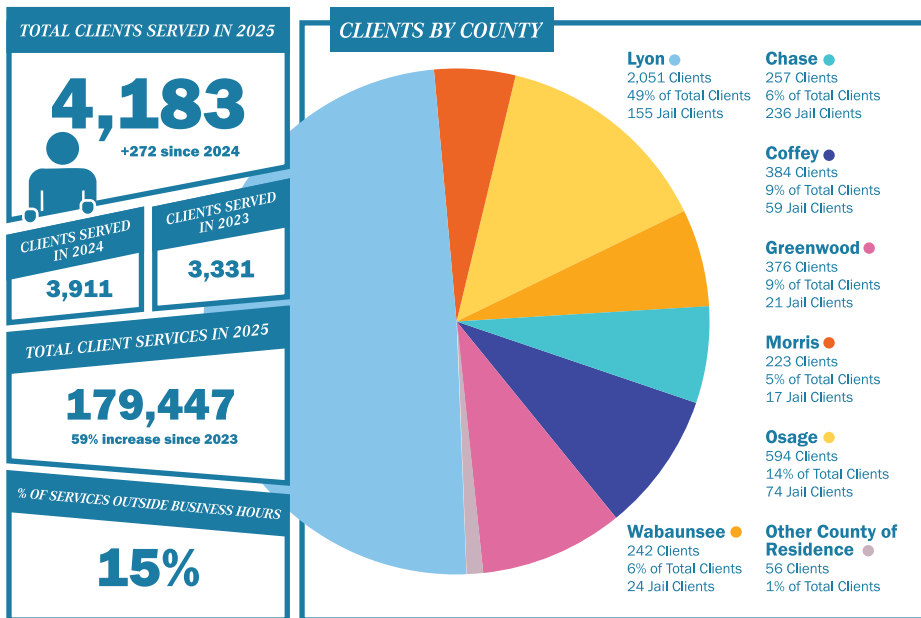
CrossWinds' Coffey County clinic has officially relocated from its previous address at 109 N. 3rd Street in Burlington to a new facility at 187 Osage St. in New Strawn.

By positioning services in New Strawn, the agency is working to reduce travel barriers and ensure that more residents can connect with the support they need in a timely and convenient manner. In addition to improved accessibility, the new space allows CrossWinds to significantly expand its service capacity by providing additional room for adult group programming and the growth of substance use disorder services.

CrossWinds served 384 individual clients in Coffey County in 2025. With added space, an improved location, and new treatment offerings, CrossWinds anticipates serving even more individuals in 2026.

"Given the growth we've had in Coffey County, finding a new space to host services was a priority for us," said Development and Logistics Director Lucas Moody. "As an agency, we're really focusing on improving care for residents in our more rural counties. This is an exciting step in that process. We're looking forward to all the opportunities the new clinic brings to grow services and support more individuals and families in the community."

Community members are encouraged to visit the new location during regular business hours (8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday-Friday) to learn more about available services. Through this transition, CrossWinds remains focused on delivering high-quality, compassionate care while continuing to adapt to the evolving needs of Coffey County.
